ODI Drug appraisals continue to give CLOT some NICE work

NICE (National Institute for Clinical Excellence) advise the government on the licensing of medicines. As part of this process, they seek the opinions of professional bodies like CLOT that have an interest in any new relevant drugs under development. CLOT has attended several work- shops already, focusing on the ODI's and will be attending a scoping workshop on the 8th May to carry out an appraisal of Edoxaban tosylate for the treatment and secondary prevention of deep vein thrombosis and / or pulmonary embolism.

A message from the National Nursing and Midwifery Network (NNMN) – reporting Hospital Acquired Thrombosis (HAT)

Root Cause Analysis (RCA) is a key activity in the drive to reduce the incidence of HAT, Learning from RCA's can be used to enhance local practice and ultimately save lives. Members of the NNMN have reported challenges in ensuring that all events where a RCA should be completed, i.e. any episode of venous thromboembolism arising in the 90 days following admission to hospital, are reported and included in the process. This is especially true when the VTE is diagnosed and managed in a different hospital to where the original admission and VTE risk assessment took place. It would therefore like to ask all staff who are collating this data to forward any incidents of VTE which initially occurred outside their own Trust to the relevant hospital. This will ensure that each Trust is able to capture a true picture of the management of VTE prevention and ensure relevant learning takes place.
